I. Admission Policy

1. Ideal Candidates

Graduate School of Medical and Dental Health Sciences (Doctoral Program) seeks students who can address a wide range of issues from regional to international healthcare, precision medicine, neuroscience, and dental medicine through interdisciplinary research. Desired qualities include:

- Interest in domestic and global healthcare challenges, with motivation to solve them from a glocal perspective
- Ability to utilize genetic analysis, molecular biology, AI, and big data to understand biological systems and advance personalized medicine
- Flexibility to address aging-related issues, and explore new methods for prevention, diagnosis, and treatment of neurological and oral health conditions
- Leadership skills in multidisciplinary healthcare settings, with a commitment to comprehensive care
- Motivation and ability to develop innovative approaches using cutting-edge technologies and interdisciplinary perspectives

2. Required Qualities and Abilities

- Basic Academic Knowledge: Equivalent to university graduate level, including English proficiency
- Interdisciplinary Perspective: Motivation to contribute to healthcare through exploratory and translational research
 - Problem-Solving Ability: Initiative to develop and pursue original research topics
 - Communication Skills: Willingness to contribute to both local and global healthcare
- Ethics and Social Contribution: Aspiration to become a leading educator, researcher, or advanced healthcare professional

3. Basic Policy for Student Selection

To ensure diversity, applicants are selected through three categories based on a comprehensive review of application documents:

1 General Selection

- Medical & Dental Programs: Includes English language and oral examinations
- English Exam: Assesses reading, writing, and communication skills, as well as basic knowledge in the chosen field
- **Oral Exam:** Evaluates subject knowledge, problem-solving ability, communication skills, interdisciplinary perspective, ethics, and social contribution

2 Special Selection for Working Adults

- **Medical Program**: Includes English and oral exams (same evaluation criteria as above)
- **Dental Program**: Oral exam only, evaluating subject knowledge, problem-solving ability, language and communication skills, interdisciplinary perspective, ethics, and social contribution

3 Special Selection for International Students

- **Medical Program**: Includes English and oral exams (same evaluation criteria as above)
 - **Dental Program**: Oral exam only, same evaluation criteria as above
