I . Admission Policy

1. Desired Student Profile

Graduate School of Medical and Dental Sciences (Master's Program)

To foster highly specialized professionals, researchers, and educators who can contribute to education and research in fields such as medical science, oral health and welfare, nursing science, and next-generation medical technology, and who can respond to diverse medical challenges and needs, we seek students with the following qualities and abilities:

- Individuals with fundamental academic ability and knowledge equivalent to a bachelor's degree, and a strong desire to contribute to society as researchers or highly specialized professionals.
- Individuals with sufficient English proficiency necessary for life science research and specialized study, as well as communication skills and cooperativeness.
- Individuals with a deep interest and clear purpose in their chosen field, who are willing to engage in original research and apply its outcomes to benefit healthcare and society.
- Individuals with an international perspective, who respect cultural and social diversity, and can play a leading and specialized role in multidisciplinary collaboration and team-based medical care.
- Individuals, including working professionals and international students, who possess a strong sense of ethics and are committed to contributing to local and global communities.

2. Required Qualities and Abilities

- Basic Knowledge in Academic Fields
Possess fundamental knowledge in their specialized field.
- Interdisciplinary and Multifaceted Perspective
Have the motivation to integrate knowledge from multiple academic disciplines and approaches to create new knowledge and value, without being confined to a single field.
- Problem-Solving Ability
Demonstrate a proactive and collaborative attitude toward addressing complex social issues, along with basic research skills necessary for such efforts.
- Communication Skills
Be capable of collecting, organizing, and disseminating information using advanced language skills, including English.
- Ethics and Social Contribution Awareness
Possess a strong sense of ethics and a commitment to contributing to both local and international communities.

3. Basic Policy for Student Selection

Admissions to the Master's Program of the Graduate School of Medical and Dental Sciences are conducted through the following three categories. Each category includes document screening, a foreign language (English) examination, and an oral examination. The subjects of the examinations vary by program, so please check the specific requirements for each selection category.

① General Selection

All programs—Medical Science, Nursing Science, Next-Generation Medical Technology, and Oral Health and Welfare—require both a foreign language (English) examination and an oral examination.

The English exam evaluates communication skills, including reading and writing abilities necessary for research, as well as basic knowledge related to the desired academic field.

The oral exam assesses knowledge of the desired academic field, problem-solving ability, communication skills, interdisciplinary and multifaceted perspectives, and attitudes regarding ethics and social contribution.

② Special Selection for Working Professionals

For the Medical Science, Nursing Science, and Next-Generation Medical Technology programs, both a foreign language (English) examination and an oral examination are required.

The English exam evaluates communication skills, including reading and writing abilities necessary for research, as well as basic knowledge related to the desired academic field.

The oral exam assesses knowledge of the desired academic field, problem-solving ability, communication skills, interdisciplinary and multifaceted perspectives, and attitudes regarding ethics and social contribution.

For the Oral Health and Welfare program, only an oral examination is conducted, which evaluates knowledge of the desired academic field, problem-solving ability, communication skills including language proficiency, interdisciplinary and multifaceted perspectives, and attitudes regarding ethics and social contribution.

③ Special Selection for International Students

For the Medical Science program, both a foreign language (English) examination and an oral examination are required.

The English exam evaluates communication skills, including reading and writing abilities necessary for research, as well as basic knowledge related to the desired academic field.

The oral exam assesses knowledge of the desired academic field, problem-solving ability, communication skills, interdisciplinary and multifaceted perspectives, and attitudes regarding ethics and social contribution.

For the Oral Health and Welfare, Nursing Science, and Next-Generation Medical Technology programs, only an oral examination is conducted, which evaluates knowledge of the desired academic field, problem-solving ability, communication skills including language proficiency, interdisciplinary and multifaceted perspectives, and attitudes regarding ethics and social contribution.

III. General Selection

1. Eligibility

Applicants must meet one of the following criteria (1)–(11).

Applicants who fall under criteria (6) or (9)–(11) must undergo a preliminary eligibility screening before applying. Please refer to Section VIII for details and submit the required documents during the designated period.

- (1) Graduated from a university as defined in Article 83 of the School Education Act (Act No. 26 of 1947) with a program duration of four years or more, or expected to graduate by March of Reiwa 8 (2026).
- (2) Awarded a bachelor's degree under Article 104, Paragraph 7 of the School Education Act, or expected to be awarded by March 2026.
- (3) Completed 16 years of formal education in a foreign country, or expected to complete by March 2026.
- (4) Completed a 16-year curriculum through correspondence education from a foreign institution while residing in Japan, or expected to complete by March 2026.
- (5) Completed a curriculum at an educational institution in Japan recognized by the Minister of Education as equivalent to a foreign university offering a 16-year curriculum, or expected to complete by March 2026.
- (6) Awarded a degree equivalent to a bachelor's degree by completing a curriculum of at least three years at a foreign university or institution recognized by the relevant government or agency, or expected to be awarded by March 2026.
- (7) Completed a specialized course at a vocational school (with a duration of four years or more and meeting other criteria set by the Minister of Education), or expected to complete by March 2026.
- (8) Designated by the Minister of Education (Notification No. 5, 1953).
- (9) Admitted to a graduate school under Article 102, Paragraph 2 of the School Education Act and recognized by this graduate school as having the academic ability to pursue graduate-level education.
- (10) Studied at a university for at least three years by March 31, 2026, and earned credits with excellent academic performance as recognized by this graduate school.
- (11) Recognized by this graduate school through individual screening as having academic ability equivalent to or higher than a university graduate, and will be at least 22 years old by March 31, 2026.

Applicants must meet one of the criteria (1)–(11) listed above **and** have at least one year of practical experience (as of March 2026) in health, medical, or welfare-related work at a facility, educational/research institution, government agency, or company. Applicants must also maintain their employment status after enrollment.

Applicants who fall under criteria (6) or (9)–(11) must undergo a preliminary eligibility screening before applying. Please refer to Section VIII and submit the required documents by the deadline.

- (1) Individuals who have graduated from a university as defined in Article 83 of the School Education Act (Act No. 26 of 1947), with a course duration of four years or more, or those expected to graduate by March 2026.
